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| | Alfalfa Organic | Our most popular sprout with a delicious nutty flavour. Excellent for salads, omelettes and sandwiches. High in fibre, vitamins, minerals and proteins. Research has found Alfalfa fibre pushes cholesterol out of the arteries while its saponins also scrub and dissolve it. The sprouts are many times more nutritious if exposed to the sunlight about the fifth day after germination. They can then be harvested. | \$0.04 |
| | Alyssum White | Attractive beneficial insect plant sought after by grape growers and orchardists alike because: · It is easy to grow and drought tolerant · It self sows readily and flowers over a long season · Sowing can be timed for when it is most needed · It looks good and has a low growing habit · drifts of snow! · It is ideal for predator insects as umbelliferae flowers with shallow florets suit their short mouth parts. Sow 1 row for every 6-8 rows of trees or vines at 1 gram of seed per 2m2 (2500 seeds/gram). Lightly rake to cover. Keep moist for 7-10 days. | \$0.38 |
| | Amaranthus Illumination | Edible bronze foliage with Scarlet and Yellow bracts. This makes a bold colourful border statement, lasting well into autumn. | \$0.07 |
| | Amaranthus Perfecta | Splendid tricolour Amaranth with Red, Yellow and Green bracts. Excellent cutflower border plant and, being an edible Chinese spinach, you can use it in cooking or as a colourful garnish. The cut flowers last well in water and can also be dried. If this is done carefully the flowers keep their colour for some time. For pot plants provide a humid atmosphere. | \$0.07 |
| | Artichoke Green Globe | An improved Artichoke strain suitable for the home garden. The mature flower buds are globe-shaped and have an attractive rich deep green colour without the purple tinge. Sharp spines are almost totally eliminated on both the leaves and buds, making it much easier to harvest. The fleshy base of the petals and the meaty heart are the most edible parts. Buds are usually cut when 6-10cm in diameter. Vigorous and prolific plants grow up to a height of 1.8m and will produce the first year from seed but are usually better when cut back and carried over to the second year. | | Arugula Italian Wild Rustic | Spicy salad green, great for cut and come again leaf harvesting. Similar in taste to the cultivated Rocket but much slower to bolt with deep lobed or indented dark green leaves. Sometimes described as perennial by nature, in our climate this tends to be more annual. However, lifespan can be lengthened through shading and keeping it evenly watered and cool over summer. Cultivated since ancient Roman times. (55 days) | \$4.66 |
| | Asclepias Butterfly Flower | Highly ornamental and excellent in attracting the Monarch Butterfly to your garden. The umbel-shaped flower head makes an appealing cut flower with its colour range of Dark Pink, White, Gold, Orange and Red. The stems are rigid however the latex sap needs to be heat sealed in if you want to cut them. Dipping the cut end in very hot water for 30 seconds is enough to do it. A spring sowing should yield flowers the first season (220 days). | \$0.33 |

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| | Basil Red Opal Organic | Bronze red foliage and a sweet taste with cinnamon tones. Excellent to add to salads or to cook with. Compact growing makes it a great container plant or to colour contrast green herbs. | \$0.01 |
| | Basil Sweet Genovese Organic | Broad Leaved Sweet Italian Basil. The standard most commonly grown variety of Basil with large fine flavoured shiny green leaves. Widely grown under glass in Italy for the production of Pesto and suitable for both drying and fresh use. Our most popular large leaf Basil. | \$0.01 |
| | Bean Blue Lake Runner Organic | A straight, string-less, smooth, dark green bean with excellent freezing or processing qualities. The pods are round, tender and meaty and 15-18cm in length on vigorous, heavy yielding plants (55-60 days) | \$0.02 |
| | Bean Broad Dwarf Early Green Treated | Popular Italian Fava bean for simple yet gourmet cooking. The early and vigorous plants have 25cm pods each with 6-7 seeds and pods that are bright green at maturity and are excellent sautéed with garlic. Broad Beans are like peas and prefer to grow in the cooler months of spring and autumn avoiding hot weather. Support to one metre may be required. Harvest 75 days from sowing. | \$0.03 |
| | Bean Broad Superaguadulce Treated | This vibrant, bright green variety originating in Seville and currently enjoyed worldwide, is renowned for its 25cm pods with 7-9 seeds. Easy to grow in almost any soil conditions this bean will satisfy the palate of any enthusiast. The large, meaty, light green beans are succulent, tasty and suitable for freezing. | \$0.06 |
| | Bean Cannellino Dwarf Organic | Classic dwarf Italian white kidney bean made famous in Minestrone soup and often found canned. The beans taste mildly nutty, a creamy smooth texture which stays firm and whole when cooked slowly. The large plants are very productive with 15cm plump pods that can be harvested in 80 days when they turn a yellowish green and the beans are large and greenish white. | \$0.02 |
| | Bean French Garden Filet Dwarf Organic | The classic Haricot Vert. Thin straight dark green beans that reach their full flavour when 12-15cm long and 1cm wide. The 50cm high plants yield early and heavily and should be strong enough not to need support. Easy to grow. (60 days.) | \$0.04 |
| | Bean King Of The Blues Runner | A prolific producer of purple pole beans with good heat tolerance. Regular harvest will encourage further pod production. | \$0.03 |
| | Bean Rocdor Dwarf Organic | This buttery yellow bean is an excellent performer with great flavour. The uniform pods are 15cm long with black seeds. Tolerates both extreme heat and cold and flourishes in high humidity where other beans may be difficult to grow. 52 days to harvest means it is an early producer. | \$0.04 |
| | Bean Scarlet Runner | Popular summer variety with long flat dark green pods that are suitable for blanching, freezing or simply fresh. An added attraction is their beautiful display of red and white flowers. Can be treated as a perennial but care should be taken to cull plants that become thrifty over the years. Grow in fresh ground and keep well fertilized. | \$0.07 |

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| | Bean Slenderette Dwarf Organic | Dwarf high quality bean with fresh crisp flavour and excellent yield potential. Uniform rounded dark green pods to 17cm. Perfect for home gardeners and commercial growers alike. For fresh use or for freezing. Medium maturity 53 days. | \$0.01 |
| | Bean Wonder of Venice Runner | Productive and tasty tall growing yellow bean. Noted for its continual flowering habit and broad flattened 18cm long pods with round black seeds. A popular garden variety in the north of Italy, it is also known in Austria and Southern Germany as 'Rheinegold'. | \$0.03 |
| | Beet Sugar | The alternative to sugar cane that doesn't require the tropics to grow. Cultivated as a commercial crop since the 1750's in Poland, this beet is still grown around the world for the extraction of its sugar content. Also ideal for sweetening preserves by putting a few slices in the tin or bottle, in making home wine and as a high energy crop for animals. Sow early spring or autumn to avoid summer bolting. | | Beetroot Detroit Dark Red Organic | Globular shaped variety with excellent flavour, use fresh or canned. Dark green foliage with red veins also makes this a colourful addition for baby leaf salads. Direct sow seeds 15cm apart or sow in seeds trays and plant out when 3-5cm tall. 50-55 days from germination to harvest. | \$0.19 |
| | Borage | Starflower. A popular culinary herb in the Middle Ages, it is now grown mostly for its bright blue, edible flowers that have a cucumber like flavour and as an excellent bee plant. Young leaves can be chopped and added to summer salads, or cooked like spinach. The flowers may be used as a garnish or floated in summer drinks. Borage contains a substance called gamma linolenic acid (GLA) that studies have shown can kill brain and prostate cancer cells and inhibit the growth of malignant tumours by restricting blood vessel growth. GLA is also found in Evening Primrose Oil. | \$0.05 |
| | Broccoli De Cicco Organic | Italian Heirloom. Produces a light green 10-15cm central head followed by a large yield of side spears. For spring or autumn production. | \$0.03 |
| | Broccoli Precoce Romanesco | For generations gardeners in northern Italy have grown Romanesco Broccoli. It is unlike regular Broccoli, forming highly decorative light green clusters of heads that resemble sea coral. The tip of each spear is conical rather than round but the taste is true Broccoli. Always pick before spears flower. Italian Broccoli must have cool weather as heads develop so an early spring or autumn planting is best. Do not over-apply nitrogenous fertilizers. | | Broccoli Sprouting Summer Purple | A versatile Sprouting Broccoli bred for summer production. High yields of tender fine-flavoured purple shoots are produced on large framed plants. Sow from early spring to mid summer in most locations then switch to Broccoli Winter Rudolph for autumn/winter cropping. | \$0.01 |

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| | Broccoli Sprouting Winter Rudolph | Beautiful deep purple florets on good sized green stems that are sweet and tender, on large framed plants. Sow from mid summer onwards. Plants produce over a harvest periods or 3-5 weeks so sowings 3-4 weeks will increase the season. Harvest the florets when they are mini-sized and lightly steam or microwave to maintain the wonderful purple colour. Prefers fertile heavy soil types. Maturity 70-90 days from transplant. | \$0.07 |
| | Brussels Sprouts Long Island Improved | Vertical plants perfect for inter-planting. The formation of sprouts is stimulated by pulling off some of the leaves below each sprout so that the growth is directed to the buds. Complementary to the small garden, an extended season can be prolonged by harvesting the largest buds first. A second crop will result if sprouts are cut neatly from the stem leaving as much of the spur as possible. In fact, a few good plants will yield an abundant crop. Avoid fertilizing with nitrogen. | \$0.03 |
| | Burdock Takinogawa Long | Highly nutritious root vegetable and one of the most valued herbal medicines. Peeled leaf stalks are parboiled and used as a substitute for Cardoon. Young roots can be peeled and used in salads like radishes whilst older roots are stir-fried, sautéed, roasted or pickled. Mild bittersweet flavour. Rich in vitamins and minerals especially iron and used medicinally as a diuretic and blood cleanser. Grows rapidly with huge rhubarb-type leaves. Well dug soil will result in roots up to 1m long. Easy to grow. | \$0.07 |
| | Cabbage Conehead | Tasty green cone-shaped mini cabbage. Early maturing dense heads of 1 to 1,2 kg have sweet tender thin leaves for refreshing summer coleslaws or cooked dishes. Best grown through the cooler spring and early summer months. Maturity 80 days from sowing but in milder climates can be cropped for autumn as well. | \$0.03 |
| | Cabbage Red Express Organic | Extra early, round red cabbage. The compact plant forms a solid 1-2kg head approximately 63 days from transplant with good appearance and flavour. Will hold quite well without splitting. Best sown spring and autumn. | \$0.03 |
| | Cabbage Tat Soi | Non-heading Chinese Cabbage / Tah Tsai. An easily grown green with spoon-shaped dark green glossy leaves, suitable for stir-fry dishes, soups, salads, or boiling with meat or other vegetables. Can be sown from spring through to autumn. Plants grow erect under high temperatures, but show a prostrate habit under lower temperatures. Especially suited for winter growing with excellent cold resistance. | \$0.01 |
| | Cabbage Verona Purple Savoy | European heirloom. Large, slightly savoyed, dark green, purple tinged leaves producing a solid head 3-4kg. Purple colour enhanced by cool, overnight temperatures. Excellent flavour. | \$0.03 |
| | Cabbage Vertus Savoy | Select Savoy with well crinkled and crimped outer leaves and excellent internal quality. The plant develops a medium flat round head with short stems that can be harvested at 2-3kg in size. Holds well in the garden. | \$0.03 |
| | Cabbage Yukina Savoy | Yukina Savoy looks like a larger and savoyed version of Tatsoi. The thick, dark green, shiny, spoon-shaped leaves grow upright on pale green petioles. This vigorous and easy to grow plant is heat and cold resistant and can be grown year round. It has a mild flavor when harvested young. | \$0.03 |

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| | Calendula Dwarf Colours Mix | Compact bushy plants are covered with 7-8cm blooms in a wonderful mix of standard and pastel coloured flowers. Perfect for pots. | \$0.07 |
| | Calendula Nova | This is the favoured herbal old-fashioned single pot Marigold variety with only two or three rows of Yellow or Orange petals around a brown centre. Popular component in ointments and tinctures | \$0.42 |
| | Capsicum Colour Mix | A colourful blend of open pollinated sweet bell peppers including lemon, orange, red, purple, golden yellow, white and chocolate. Bell peppers are usually 3 or 4 lobed with thick flesh and a hollow chamber. They can be harvested young at a green stage but are sweeter and tastier when fully ripe. Maturity 80 days from transplant. | \$0.02 |
| | Capsicum Purple Beauty | The best open pollinated purple Bell Pepper currently available. The short bushy 45cm plants generally provide good leaf cover for fruit. The colour goes from green to purple to deep red. Great for salads, as well as stuffed or as a colourful addition to raw vege platters and cooked cuisine. Each plant normally yields 5-12 blocky 8cm x 8cm colourful fruits if started early and well fertilised. (70-75 days) | \$0.13 |
| | Capsicum Topepo Rosso | A small sweet red round pepper from Northern Italy made famous for its versatility - fresh, fried, roasted, pickled, put in a salsa or stuffed. The short compact plants can be grown in large pots and are very productive with masses of 10cm by 5cm round flat fruit with thick sweet flesh that ripens to an intense blood red high in Vit C. Grow in a sunny position in rich well drained soil. (100 days) | \$0.10 |
| | Capsicum Yellow Banana | Sweet Long Yellow Banana. A light yellow to red, long and pointed fruit to 15cm. Sweet Hungarian type, with thick sweet flesh. Excellent flavour and adds an attractive yellow touch to any meal. Good for frying, sandwiches, pickling and for marketing. Plants are sturdy and upright. An early and heavy cropper. | | Caraway | Grown mainly for its seeds which add a licorice-like European character to recipes for cakes, breads, biscuits, many vegetable dishes, pickles and coleslaw. Use young leaves in soups, meats, salads and cheese dishes. | \$0.01 |
| | Carrot Lubyana | These yellow carrots are a Slovenian Heirloom, with a bright yellow root and a mild sweet flavour. Decorative when served with bright orange carrots. | \$0.20 |
| | Carrot Rainbow Mix | A colourful mixture of five varieties of baby carrot - Atomic Red, Bambino, Cosmic Purple, Lunar White and Solar Yellow. Great fun in the home garden and an intriguing specialty for farmers or growers markets. | \$1.65 |
| | Carrot Scarlet Nantes Organic | A long time favourite with a sweet crisp flavour, terrific for juicing, baby vegetables or as keepers. The bright orange cylindrical to slightly tapered roots grow to 25cm long and are very uniform. (70 days) | \$0.41 |

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| | Cauli Greens | Actually a White Sprouting Broccoli but traditionally called Cauli Greens because you eat the leaves that circle the white floret, the floret itself and the stalk. Early and prolific, you can be eating it mid winter to early spring. Pick the central spear when first harvesting to encourage side shoots. Best steamed to help retain all the vitamins. | \$0.03 |
| | Cauliflower Green Macerata | An attractive lime green Cauliflower with very good flavour. It is a vigorous grower reaching 1-1.3kg in 85-90 days. Sow early spring or late summer. | \$0.02 |
| | Cauliflower Snowball Organic | Popular home gardener's variety with solid, tightly formed white curds. Best grown as an autumn or spring crop. | \$0.02 |
| | Cauliflower Violet Sicilian Organic | In appearance a cross between Broccoli and Cauliflower. The florets of this Cauliflower are Rosy-violet and with fine texture, good flavour and ease of culture, this variety is a must for Cauliflower growers. High mineral content accounts for colour. Excellent for freezing, but the colour will fade upon cooking, so therefore use raw to add an intriguing colour to salads and dips. Sow early spring or late summer. (85 days) | \$0.02 |
| | Celeriac Sedano di Verona | Also known as Turnip Rooted Celery. Only the large swollen base of the stem, brown on the outside and white on the inside is considered edible. Celeriac can be used raw in salads, eaten as a cooked vegetable or used in soups and stews. Sedano is a medium early type with good bolt resistance. It will weigh 1.8-2kg at maturity and has a firm interior quality that remains white when boiled. Remove side shoots as they appear when the plant grows and swells. Harvest when bulbs are 7.5-10cm. Roots can be stored in sand for winter use. | ##### |
| | Celery for Cutting | Excellent dwarf celery for growing as a pot herb in containers. Rich dark green colour. Use the stems and leaf fresh in salads and as a lunch box nibble or cook in soups and stews as you would for regular celery. Prefers a sunny position. | ##### |

| | Chicory Palla Rossa Early Organic | Bright red medium size radicchio well wrapped with crisp ribs and numerous leaves. Classic tart slightly bitter taste, excellent in salads or as colourful plate liners. Cooking removes bitterness. Cool weather enhances red colouring in leaves. After cutting main head, cover stump with straw for a secondary crop of blanched (white) Witloof-type heads. | \$0.01 |
| | Chicory Sugarloaf Organic | This Chicory forms a head like a large Cos Lettuce which can be cut and used as Witloof, Endive or Lettuce, through autumn and winter. The leaves fold into dense heads being green on the outside and light yellow inside, while growing in the open ground without any kind of forcing. When cut the crowns may re-sprout after the first crop. Sow seeds from mid-summer to early autumn for best flavour and growth. Withstands light frosts. | \$3.68 |
| | Chilli Cayenne Blend | An edible and highly ornamental blend of coloured Cayenne chillis. The prolific 7.5cm tapered fruits mature to either red, yellow, purple or orange and are very pungent. If dried they will maintain their colour. | \$0.05 |

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| | Chilli Cavenne Long Thin Organic | Popular in many Asian and Indonesian countries, the Peppers, green or red, whole, dried or pickled, are used as condiments or crushed and ground for seasoning. Often curled and twisted, growing to 12cm long and tapering to a point, changing from dark green to bright red at maturity. (72 days) | \$0.03 |
| | Chilli Hungarian Yellow Wax | A hot banana type Pepper with bright Canary yellow waxy tapering fruits which turn red when fully mature. Good flavoured, medium hot, 15cm long Peppers grow prolifically on small compact bushes. (65 days) | \$0.13 |
| | Chilli Joe E Parker Organic | Locally sourced, mild strength chilly. | \$0.13 |
| | Chives Broad Leaf | Good performance of the broader leaf style of Chives makes this very suitable for pot culture or processing. Good vigour and disease resistance. | \$0.75 |
| | Chives Garlic New Belt | Chinese Chives, Gow Choy (Chinese) or Nira (Japanese). An attractive perennial closely related to common Chives but with a mild garlic, rather than onion flavour. The blossom is a flat headed spray of star-shaped flowers that faintly smell of roses, so if grown indoors on a sunny windowsill they perfume your kitchen and can be as pretty as any flowering houseplant. The wide leaves are flat, solid, and dark green. The plant grows into a clump, instead of a single bulb, and forms many tubers on a horizontal rootstock. Chinese herbalists recommend this species of Allium for the treatment of various ailments. | \$0.75 |
| | Cleome Mixed Colours | Spider Flower. A spectacular tender annual flowering from mid-summer until autumn frosts. The beautiful ball shaped flower heads 15-18cm across produce a succession of scented airy blooms in Pink, Rose, Carmine and Violet radiating from the tall stems like the legs of a spider, hence its common name. Sow seeds directly in the garden after all danger of frost has passed or start seeds indoors 4-6 weeks before last frost date. Light aids germination, also pre-chilling seeds may assist. | \$0.07 |
| | Clover Crimson | Multipurpose nitrogen fixing legume and beneficial insect plant. Sow late summer for rapid bulky upright growth. It goes dormant in the cold of winter before resuming growth in spring up to 1m high and sporting a striking crimson bloom in early summer. Chop and dig in prior to flowering or leave for a valuable nectar rich food supply for bees and beneficial insects. Sow at a rate of 250g per 100m ² or 10kg per acre (30% less if blended with a grain or grass). | \$0.06 |
| | Coriander Santo Treated | A particularly slow bolting variety of Coriander, with plenty of flavour. Considered a benchmark variety for field growing with a high leaf yield. 55 days from sowing to harvest. Sow indoors in pots or trays for all year round harvesting. | \$0.19 |
| | Corn Cheftan F1 | A yellow supersweet type corn supplied as UNTREATED seed. It has good seedling vigour and a strong medium tall plant habit with resistance to common rust. The cobs have excellent tip fill and tender sweet kernels, maturing approximately 79 days from seedling emergence. | \$0.03 |

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| | Corn for Popping | Popcorn is a type of corn that expands from the kernel and puffs up when heated. It's easy to grow, exactly the same as sweetcorn or maize over the summer months and is left to fully ripen on the plants before the cobs are picked. To fully dry, pull back the paper like sheath surrounding the cob and hang in bunches in a well ventilated position. 100-120 days to maturity from sowing. | \$0.03 |
| | Corn Poppy Flanders Red | Flanders Poppy / Soldiers Poppy. Brilliant Scarlet Red 7.5cm wide single flowers usually with a Black blotch at the base of the petals, appears growing wild in fields and alongside railway tracks all over England and much of Europe. "In Flanders Fields the Poppies blow between the crosses row on row". From the poem by John McCrae. | ##### |
| | Corn Salad Dutch Large Seeded Organic | Excellent salad green suitable for whole plant harvest. This variety has a slightly larger leaf than Verte de Cambrai and has a more upright habit. | \$0.01 |
| | Cress American Upland | Very similar to Watercress but much easier to grow. A Rosette of dark green, glossy, rounded leaves. The young leaves make a slightly bitter substitute for Watercress in sandwiches and salads or can be steamed for a few minutes and used as a vegetable. Very slow to bolt and longstanding. | \$0.13 |
| | Cress Broad Leaf | Quick growing, high yielding type with smooth leaves and a slight peppery taste. Holds well after cutting without wilting. Ideal addition to salads, sandwiches or chopped in soups. Useful item in Baby Leaf mixes. | \$0.15 |
| | Cucumber Crystal Apple | Apple size cucumber with sweet taste and crisp juicy flesh that can be eaten thin skin and all. Easy to grow and heavy cropping, it will set fruit even in dry conditions. When ripe the fruit have small white spines (soft prickles) and faint green markings running from the blossom end to the stem, similar to Cucumber Lemon. | \$0.13 |
| | Cucumber Homemade Pickles | Gherkins. Especially bred for pickling, these medium green cucumbers have solid crisp flesh and excellent flavour. Harvest when just 5cm long for tiny sweet pickles or at full size 12 to 15cm for robust dills and spears. A very vigorous grower which will welcome support and reward you with excellent and heavy yields over a long season. Very disease resistant. (55 days) | \$0.08 |
| | Cucumber Mini White | Tasty thin skinned and tender mini white cucumber for eating fresh or pickling. Mild, sweet flavour, no bitterness and no need to peel. Best eaten when 7.5 cm long Prolific vines rarely exceed 1m in length. Feed and mulch well. Maturity 55 days from transplant. | \$0.33 |
| | Cucumber Spacemaster | Compact bushy Cucumber vine that can be grown in containers, tubs or pots. Great for smaller gardens with abundant yields but only requiring one third of the space of standard cucumbers. Produces uniform 20cm fruits that are thin skinned. Pick regularly for continued yield. Adaptable to a wide range of climates. Prefers evenly moist fertile soil. | \$0.10 |
| | Cucumber Tendergreen Organic | High yielding and sweet, smooth skinned cucumber with a tender green skin which can be eaten without peeling. Transplant outside one week after last frost into fertile well limed soil in a sunny position. Start harvesting 17cm long fruit 55 days from transplant. | \$0.11 |

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| | Eggplant Black Beauty Organic | Large teardrop shaped purple fruit borne in abundance on bushy plants. The multi branched plant habit can be encouraged to crop heavily with an early sowing, generous mulching and feeding then prompt harvest of mature fruit to allow further bud set. | \$0.05 |
| | Eggplant Florence Round Purple | Violetta di Firenze / Italian Lavender and White Eggplant. A beautiful and unusual Eggplant that will be one of the surprise stars in your garden. The oblong to round fruits in shades of rich Lavender colour are sometimes striped with a creamy white. Watch them daily as they grow and change colour. The fruits are so attractive the inclination may be not to pick them but they taste as good as they look. | \$0.10 |
| | Eggplant Long Purple Organic | Early dark glossy cylindrical eggplant also known as Early Long or Italian Heirloom. The non bitter fruit are shaped like 20cm long hot dogs and are pendant on quite tall bushes maturing 90 days from transplant. Staking is recommended. | \$0.13 |
| | Epazote | Indispensable ingredient in Mexican chilli sauces and bean dishes blending extremely well with coriander. The pungent leaves have a different taste, somewhat sweet if eaten raw but earthy and spicy if cooked. It is known to aid digestion and has many anti viral and antibacterial properties. | \$0.01 |
| | Florence Fennel Romanesco Organic | Traditional European plant with a gorgeous aniseed taste.
